As I sit down to reflect on the past year at Cal Farley's Boys Ranch, I am struck by the incredible journey we have shared and the profound impact we have made together. The 2023–2024 fiscal year has been one of growth, resilience, and hope. At the heart of our work lies a steadfast commitment to empowering the youth we serve, and none of it would be possible without your unwavering belief in our mission.

This year, our focus has been on strengthening the foundation of our programs and expanding our reach to ensure every child entrusted to our care has the tools and support they need to thrive. I am excited to share some of the milestones we've achieved together:

• Launched targeted house parent recruitment efforts focused on faith-based communities, education professionals, ex-military individuals, and other mission-driven groups.

• Introduced new retention initiatives, including programs for tenured house parents and a sign-on bonus for new hires.

• Increased house parent applications to over 1,300—a significant rise from 460 in the prior year.

• Provided services in all our programs for 654 youth this year — a testament to our

growing impact.

• Acquired the Catholic Charities Building in Amarillo, Texas, through a competitive bidding process. This acquisition will allow us to transition from leased properties to a dedicated space for independent living youth by the end of 2025.

• Secured funding and developed detailed plans for the Experiential Learning Program (ELP) Center, which promises to provide transformative opportunities for Boys Ranch youth to grow, learn, and succeed.

Each of these accomplishments is a reflection of the collective effort, vision, and generosity of a community that believes in the potential of every child. Your support fuels our ability to adapt, innovate, and rise to the challenges we face.

Those areas are relationships, education, physical health and mental health.



ACCOMPLISHMENTS

HOUSE PARENT RECRUITING

Boys Ranch has made significant strides in house parent recruitment, reflecting a comprehensive overhaul of strategies. In 2023, Boys Ranch employed an average of 44 house parents. By August 2024, all 59 budgeted positions were filled. Youth care worker recruitment has also improved, with 12 of 20 budgeted positions filled as of August, up from last year's average of six. Each new house parent undergoes training to align with our mission, ensuring we're prepared to serve more youth effectively.



Catholic Charities of the Texas Panhandle has transferred a property valued at \$600,000 to Cal Farley's Boys Ranch following a competitive bidding process. Boys Ranch is making minor updates to the building, which will consolidate leases from three independent living homes into one location. This acquisition improves operational efficiency and expands our ability to support young people transitioning to adulthood, providing a centralized, enhanced facility for independent living services.



REOPENING HOMES

With increased staffing, Boys Ranch has expanded capacity by reopening three homes, allowing us to serve more youth.

These openings reflect our commitment to providing a safe, supportive environment and meeting the growing needs of our community. The additional homes ensure residents have access to the resources and opportunities they need to thrive.

RESIDENT REFERRAL INITIATIVE

Boys Ranch has enhanced its referral and admissions processes to support growth goals. The new tracking system allows for accurate monitoring of referrals and resident placement, improving census projections. For the next fiscal year, we aim to maintain and exceed our current house parent census and admit more youth by October 1, 2025.

For the first time, we are actively seeking youth referrals, targeting schools, probation offices, and other organizations. Marketing materials and outreach via social media, radio, and TV will help us increase high-quality referrals and expand our impact.

FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024

80TH ANNUAL BOYS RANCH RODEO

The 80th Annual Boys Ranch Rodeo on October 12, 2024, was a success, boosted by a new fall date and exciting features. Highlights included free admission, an upscale President's Apprecation Luncheon with a silent auction, FFA barn tours, expanded Fall Fest activities, food trucks, revamped rodeo events, special performances, and updated media content.



TAYLOR SHOW BARN

The Taylor Show Barn is complete, providing FFA students a dedicated space for animal care and preparation. A prayer and blessing ceremony marked this milestone, followed by tours of the facility.

Students are now using the state-of-the-art facility, marking a new chapter for Boys Ranch agriculture and advancing hands-on learning opportunities.

HOUSE PARENT INCENTIVES

To strengthen house parent recruitment and retention, Boys Ranch has introduced key incentives, including signing and retention bonuses for house parents, as well as referral bonuses for individuals who recommend qualified candidates.


These initiatives are actively promoted through social media and advertising, reinforcing our commitment to building a stable, skilled team dedicated to supporting our youth.

Tascosa Films, LLC is now Tascosa Enterprises, LLC, supporting for-profit ventures to benefit Cal Farley's Boys Ranch. Initiatives include retail, food, art sales, agriculture, and renewable energy, while offering youth vocational experience.

The first project, a food truck, is underway, with a fully equipped vehicle purchased to provide skills for youth transitioning into adulthood.

A Place to Transform Lives

In 1939, Cal Farley, a visionary and former semiprofessional baseball player, founded Cal Farley's Boys Ranch with a mission to help children from broken homes. This dream became a reality when Texas Panhandle rancher Julian Bivins donated 120 acres of land.

Now, 85 years later, Boys Ranch continues to grow and evolve, honoring its legacy while meeting the needs of today's children and families. What began as a modest effort quickly flourished. In 1944, Mr. Farley introduced the iconic Boys Ranch Rodeo to enhance the boys' social education. Over the decades, programs have expanded, adapting to the ever-changing challenges young people face.

Today, Cal Farley's Boys Ranch is a thriving residential community that serves boys and girls ages 5 to 18 from across the country. Nestled on a campus resembling a small town, Boys Ranch features a chapel, medical facilities, sports fields, parks, schools and group homes. Children live in supportive environments with dedicated house parents, attend on-campus schools and participate in academic, vocational, spiritual, and extracurricular activities designed to nurture their growth into confident, resilient, and responsible adults.

Beyond the campus, Cal Farley's
Boys Ranch extends its reach through
Community-Based Services, offering
support at no cost to families who are
navigating challenging circumstances.
These services equip families with the skills
and resources needed to improve their
situation.

Cal Farley's commitment doesn't end when children leave the campus. Through Alumni Services, we provide lifelong support to every alumnus, offering case management, transitional living assistance, scholarships, and more. Whether a child stayed for a few months or many years, they are always part of the Boys Ranch family.

At the heart of every program is our unwavering mission: to provide a safe environment where meaningful, trusting relationships help children unlock their full potential. By fostering strong role models and instilling core values, we guide our youth to become principled, contributing members of society

LADY RIDERS GO TO PLAYOFFS

The Lady Rough Riders, the Boys Ranch High School girls' basketball team, ended their season on Monday, February 12, 2024, in a bi-district play-off game against the Floydada High School Lady Winds. The Lady Rough Riders had a district record of 4-6 and an overall record of 11-15.

NIGHT WITH THE SOD POODLES

On July 19, 2024, the Amarillo Sod Poodles celebrated Cal Farley's Boys Ranch. Ethan Rex, a 2024 Boys Ranch graduate, threw out the first pitch. Our youth and staff enjoyed free tickets to the game, and Boys Ranch staff volunteered their time to work the concession stands, embodying our community's spirit of service and support.

FIREFIGHTING COMPETITION

Boys Ranch residents participated in the Firefighter Games at the Panhandle Firemen's and Fire Marshal's Association convention in Canyon, Texas. In the threeperson pump race, in which a water hose is assembled and must hold together with water pressure, the girls' team won first place, and the boys' team placed third.

STATE TRACK MEET

Two Boys Ranch High School students competed at the State Track Meet. Saige ran in the 800-meter race for girls, and Watera finished fifth place in the 800-meter race for boys, and placed third in the 1600-meter race, pushing himself the last 400 meters to go from eighth place to winning the bronze.



CANTATA

The youth and staff of Boys Ranch worked hard to present a beautiful presentation of the annual Boys Ranch Cantata at the Chapel. The annual event was followed with the community enjoying fellowship with a feast prepared by Dining Hall staff.



IONA PROJECT REFLECTS ON 10 YEARS

The Chapel staff hosted a 10-Year Reunion for the Iona Project, which is a one-year internship that allows young adults to work together at Boys Ranch as youth workers, but also gain spiritual guidance and support the work of the Chapel. The Iona participants of the past continue to serve through various avenues, such as church ministries, school teaching, social work, care giving, hospice chaplaincy, graduate school and military service.

COLLEGE ATHLETES

Four Boys Ranch seniors from the Class of 2024 signed commitment letters to play college athletics. They were Ethan, baseball at Amarillo College; Gracia, soccer at Cowley College; Aletha, basketball at Clarendon Community College; and Dylan, football at Oklahoma Panhandle State University.

COURAGE IN FOOTBALL

The University Interscholastic League (UIL) has classified Boys Ranch ISD as 1A, which means Boys Ranch High School played six-man football for the first time. This caught the attention of a production company that featured the Boys Ranch Roughriders on the national CBS program, Courage in Sports.

17TH ANNUAL CARDBOARD BOAT RACE

Boys, girls, and staff members collaborated to build 19 boats for the 17th Annual Cardboard Boat Race. The event was a lively spectacle, drawing enthusiasm from participants and spectators while showcasing the vibrant community spirit and the unique, hands-on learning experiences that Boys Ranch fosters.

Cal Farley's Boys Ranch is committed to supporting our former residents well into adulthood, fostering a bond much like that of a traditional family.



The Transitional Living Program at Cal Farley's Boys Ranch equips upcoming and recent graduates to adjust to life in new communities, providing essential support during this crucial period. This program goes beyond basic support, helping residents gain valuable life skills like obtaining a driver's license, attending college visits, and exploring career paths. Each semester, Cal Farley's Merit Scholarship Program supports alumni in pursuing further education by providing scholarships for expenses at trade schools, junior colleges and universities. From the Fall of 2023 through the Summer of 2024, 19 students graduated from college. There were two with master's degrees, eight with bachelor's degrees, three with associate's degrees and six certifications.

This generous, donor-funded program helps former residents annually, empowering them to achieve their educational goals. For more than 40 years, hundreds of scholarships have been awarded to qualifying alumni, offering them a pathway to success.




FALYN

Her faith in Jesus also provides her with strength and guidance during challenging times.







At Cal Farley's Boys Ranch, our Family Engagement and Family Preservation programs work hand-in-hand to strengthen and support families in meaningful ways. These programs are offered to families within 100 miles of Amarillo, Texas and help families find alternative solutions to stay together and overcome challenges.

Family Preservation offers intensive case management to help keep youth in their homes, preventing the need for residential care. Family Engagement focuses on fostering open communication and compassion to build stronger relationships and promote lasting, positive change. Recognizing that he needed extra support, Heidi and Michael reached out to Cal Farley's Boys Ranch for guidance. Community-Based Services allowed Mason to live at home while the family received the help they needed to grow stronger together.

Through this program, Shawn, a dedicated Community-Based Services caseworker, became a mentor and guide for Mason. Whether playing basketball or spending time together, Shawn's presence was calming and supportive. Shawn also equipped Heidi and Michael with valuable tools to deescalate tough situations. They were also kept informed through regular updates on Mason's progress. By tailoring his schedule to fit their lives, Shawn ensured the family could focus on healing without added stress.

Heidi shared that seeking help was humbling but ultimately transformative. With Shawn's assistance, the family found renewed hope, stronger connections and the confidence to tackle future challenges constructively.
